




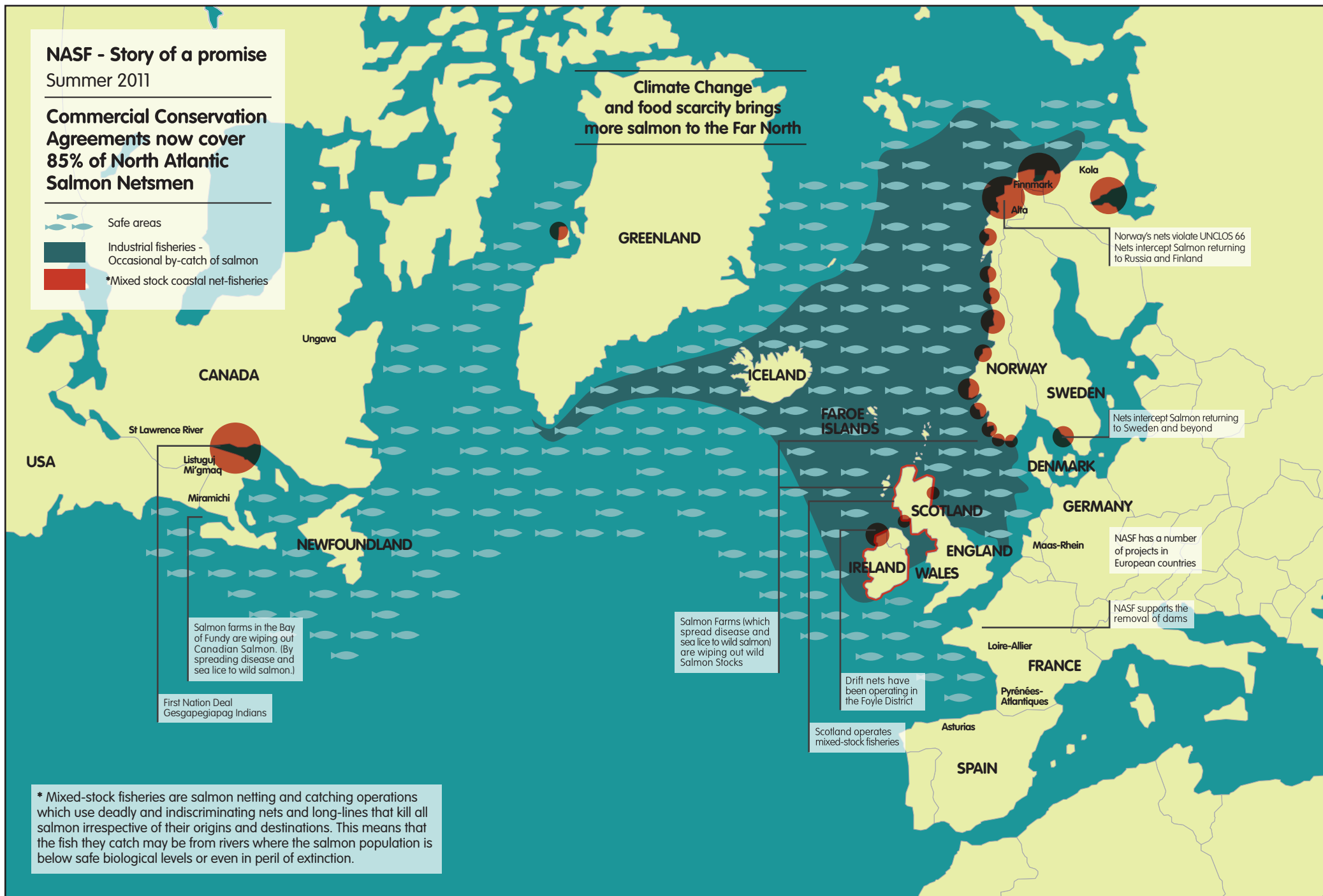

* Mixed-stock fisheries are salmon netting and catching operations which use deadly and indiscriminating nets and long-lines that kill all salmon irrespective of their origins and destinations. This means that the fish they catch may be from rivers where the salmon population is below safe biological levels or even in peril of extinction.
